Bureau of Workers' Compensation Update

Stability: In and effort to provide greater stability for employers, the BWC's administrative assessment and employer-premium rates will remain stable for 2008. Earlier this year the BWC announced the average rates for employers will remain stable for policy year 2008. Also, the BWC's operating costs also will remain stable. **Fraud Prevention**: The special investigations unit of the BWC ha successfully convicted 60 individuals for workers' compensation fraud since January of 2007. For the fiscal year ending June 30, 2007, 119 individuals were convicted of workers' compensation fraud. Successful prosecuting workers' compensation fraud saves employers valuable premium dollars by identifying and eliminating fraudulent payments.

Group Rating Work Group: The group rating program currently is being reviewed by the BWC to ensure fairness and equity are applied to all employers. The work group is comprised of BWC staff and representatives of employers, labor unions, injured-worker representatives and TPA associations.
