Safety Council Managers Conference

The 2008 BWC Safety Council Managers Conference was held on January 28. One of the items discussed was the reimbursement payment cycle for the July 1, 2007 through June 30, 2008 discount program.

The 2 percent **participation** rebate will be paid out as it has been in the past, at the October regular meeting of the Lake County Safety Council.

BWC representatives said the second 2 percent, the **performance** rebate, will be evaluated in November and mailed to eligible companies by year end.

They said the bureau is taking a harder line on reinforcing the attendance of the firm’s CEO at at least one meeting during the 2007-2008 cycle, this given the requirement change which allows the CEO to attend any regular meeting to gain the CEO credit.

They said council members may earn a maximum of **one** meeting credit toward the safety council discount for attending the Ohio Safety Congress in April in Columbus, regardless of the number of individuals, or sessions or days attended.
